

Cowboy Statue Gets Makeover

The community is invited to a gathering celebrating the makeover of the "Yesterday is Tomorrow" cowboy sculpture that stands between the Oakdale Cowboy Museum and the historic H-B on Saturday, July 26, at noon. Local volunteers and members of the Oakdale Garden Club have dedicated many hours of labor to reconstruct the base of the bronze using bricks to raise the wall and filling the empty pond that surrounded the statue with drought resistant and colorful plants. A fundraising effort raised over \$21,000.00 The statue will have 43 sponsored capstones surrounding the most photographed object in Oakdale.



Volunteer efforts were led by Dan Holman and Ed Viohl. "We got to talking one day about the pond being empty and that it was a collection point for dirt and trash. So we decided to do something about it. We're very pleased with outcome," said Holman. Funds raised will go to the Oakdale Garden Club for the upkeep and maintenance.

The gathering is planned to coincide with the National Day of the American Cowboy. What better way to honor this iconic sculpture that was commissioned by the Redevelopment Agency in 1991 to local artist Betty Saletta.

Light refreshments will be served.

CA Carriage & Horse Powered Museum

Members of the California Carriage and Horse Powered Museum contacted the Oakdale Cowboy Museum earlier this year to discuss the goals of this newly formed organization and ways that we may partner together in the future to bring additional exposure to both groups.

The California Carriage and Horse Powered Museum was founded by a group of friends who became aware of a unique collection of vehicles and equipment from the Horse Powered Era. This collection had been put together in the late 1920's and early 1930's. Many pieces were actually driven to the barn, in which they are currently housed, by horses and mules. They were unhitched



and parked were they have remained since. Sadly, in many cases the barn has deteriorated and the vehicles are in jeopardy of being destroyed by its collapse and exposure to the elements. The organization hopes to acquire these vehicles and preserve them for the benefit of our future generations.

Fast Draw & Mounted Shooters



Organizers for the National Day of the American Cowboy sought out participation from two of the fastest growing sports (no pun intended) to perform at the National Day of the American Cowboy celebration on July 26, at the Oakdale Saddle Club. For those who are uninformed on these sports, here's what you will see.

The Cowboy Mounted Shooters compete

in this fast action timed event using two .45 caliber single action revolvers loaded with black gunpowder much like those used in the late 1800's. Each contestant competes against the clock on specific riding patterns in an arena shooting at balloon targets. There are various levels for men, women, and kids.

We didn't have to look far to find two World Champions in the sport of Fast Draw. Both are Oakdale High School alumnus and have competed all over the US & Canada. Jon Rivera, the current World Champion will challenge Dan Qualls, a three time World Champion for a \$500 winner take all prize. This shooting sport combines a well tuned single-action revolver, using black powder blanks and a lightning quick draw at balloon targets to create the fastest timed sport in the world. You won't want to blink during this event!
