Scholarship Recipients Announced


We are pleased to announce our 2014 Cowboy Museum Ag Scholarship Recipients and the Lowell "Doc" Dorius Memorial Scholarship Recipient. Each will receive \$1000 towards their college education.

Clayton Brum was raised on a working cattle ranch, and knew at an early age that his western heritage would be the fuel to accomplish his dreams. Clayton has been raising bucking bulls since he was nine years old and credits this experience for teaching him many skills from running a business to crossing genetics. He is active in High School



Rodeo and has held the District 3 All Around Cowboy for 6 years in a row, in both Jr. High and High School. He earned the California State All Around title in 2013, as well as the State Bull Riding Championship. He has qualified for the National High School Rodeo Finals for the past two years in both bull riding and saddle bronc riding. Clayton plans to attend The College of Southern Idaho for two years then transfer to either Tarleton State University or Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, where he will major in Vet Science.

Austin Paddock has been involved in agriculture for most of his life. His parents instilled in him a great work ethic that has helped him inside and outside of his education. Austin has served as an officer for the Oakdale FFA Chapter for four years, as well as being the President of the
